#### Introduction

#### (Read I Peter 5:1-4)

#### I. Elders

This is an office that we do not have in the Baptist Church.

We have pastors and we have deacons.

The role being described is not the role of some sort of glorified deacon. It is the role of the pastor.

How do I know this?

Peter calls himself an elder.

### (Read vs 1)

Peter is a pastor.

John 21:16-17- Jesus asked him again, a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus told him, "Take care of my sheep." Jesus asked him a third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt sad because Jesus had asked him a third time, "Do you love me?" So Peter said to him, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you." Jesus told him, "Feed my sheep.

In Acts 5, Peter functions as the pastor of the church in Jerusalem.

The role being described is that of a shepherd. Being a shepherd is a pastor's job.

## II. Shepherd

A shepherd is someone who leads a flock. There are three roles involved in shepherding:

- 1. Guiding
- 2. Caring
- 3. Protecting

These things are primarily done through praying a teaching.

These two things- praying and teaching- are the primary job of the pastor.

Acts 6:2-..."It wouldn't be right for us to abandon our responsibilities for preaching and teaching the Word of God to help with the care of the poor.

This does not mean that the pastor is never to help with the care of the poor. It does mean that study, prayer, teaching and preaching are his primary responsibilities.

Two often within the modern church the pastor neglects his primary job for his secondary ones.

Studying, praying and teaching and preaching are the hardest part of the job. I know this from 40 years of ministry.

#### III. Jesus' Orders

Jesus was pretty specific in His orders.

When His disciples became sidetracked with worldliness- or busyness-He told them to get back to their main job of feeding his sheep.

John 21:15-17- After they had eaten breakfast, Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than the other disciples do?" Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus told him, "Feed my lambs." Jesus asked him again, a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus told him, "Take care of my sheep." Jesus asked him a third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt sad because Jesus had asked him a third time, "Do you love me?" So Peter said to him, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you." Jesus told him, "Feed my sheep.
